
EDP Registration Period Extended

The last day to register for courses offered through the Employee Development Program (EDP) has been extended until September 22. The sign-up period has been extended to accommodate the heavy vacation schedules of employees at the end of the fiscal year.

Full-term courses include Introduction to Finite Element Analysis II, DC and AC Machinery I, Computer Communications, Fundamentals/Protocols and Architectures, Programming in C, Fundamentals of Mathematics and Algebra, Trigonometry and Introduction of Calculus, Enhancing Office and Administrative Skills I, and a Study Course for Engineering-in-Training Certification.

Course schedules for the Fall/Winter semester were distributed to employees last week. A total of eight full-term offerings and 20 short courses covering a wide diversity of subject matter is being offered. Additional copies of the schedule are available by contracting Personnel, ext. 2036 or 2052.

Allowing for the extended registration period, classes will now start the first week of October rather than the week beginning September 26.

Bloodmobile Visit to PPPL 101% Successful!

Laboratory employees made bloodmobile visit to PPPL a big success!

"A fantastic success, very important, and very timely," were the words used by Suzanne S. Weisbecker, Recruitment Representative for the American Red Cross, to describe the results of the recent visit of the Penn-Jersey bloodmobile to PPPL. According to Ms. Weisbecker, PPPL employees achieved 101% of the goal set by the Red Cross and the Laboratory.

"It is really remarkable to do so well at this time of year because many people are still on vacation," she explained. Blood reserves are traditionally very low now due to the decrease in the number of donations over the summer and the extra demand placed on supplies because of the Labor Day Holiday, so this makes these pints of blood "extra valuable." Before the blood-mobile visited PPPL, Penn-Jersey regional reserves were 50% below normal.

Dr. Tobin was "especially happy" to note that there were six first-time donors and that veteran donors Eugene Baker, Olga Bernett, Dick Carlese, Sally Connell, Ron Strykowsky, and Alan Upperco received special gallon pens for having given a gallon or multiple there of over the past several years. "I am very proud with how the PPPL staff responded. It was such a critical time for the Red Cross," Tobin said.

According to Tobin, a number of complaints regarding the location and lack of screening were received. He said, "The American Red Cross had every intention of supplying screens, however, there was an internal mix up and an insufficient number were place on the truck. They have
