

PPPL More Generous Every Year 1992 United Way Goal Set at \$33,000

PPPL generosity in supporting United Way has grown steadily since 1984, when total contributions were only \$6,292. By contrast, in 1991, for the fourth straight year, the Lab exceeded its goal—reaching a record total of \$32,000 in contributions.

Says 1992 United Way Campaign Chairman Angelo Candelori, "During the last several years, we've set a very high giving standard for ourselves at the Lab, surpassing the previous year's dollar mark during almost every new campaign. This year we've set the highest goal yet for ourselves—\$33,000. It will be a challenge, but everyone knows how great our social needs are, and so I'm confident that our giving will surpass itself once again."

Educated Participants Give Generously

According to Candelori, "On December 3, Lab staff will have the opportunity to attend a meeting, see an informative, inspiring video, and hear how United Way funds are allocated. Employees will also hear the experiences of a benefactor agency, and have an opportunity to ask questions and to enjoy refreshments. With a little bit of luck, they may also win one of numerous door prizes!" Candelori emphasizes that there is no pressure to give and that all donations are confidential.

Janice Carson, United Way's Campaign Chairman, will be on hand December 3 to respond to questions

and concerns. She observes, "We've found that the better the participants understand the needs that their dollars meet, the more generously they give. We hope everyone will come to the meetings ready to ask questions, to listen, and to learn."

Each staff member will be assigned by group to one of five meetings to be held in the MGB Auditorium. (See Chart, page 4). Everyone will be given an envelope and asked to return it at the conclusion of the meeting (regardless of whether or not they contribute). To make a one-time donation, simply write a check and return it in the envelope. To sign up for payroll deduction, use the form provided with the envelope. ♦

Where Your United Way Money Goes

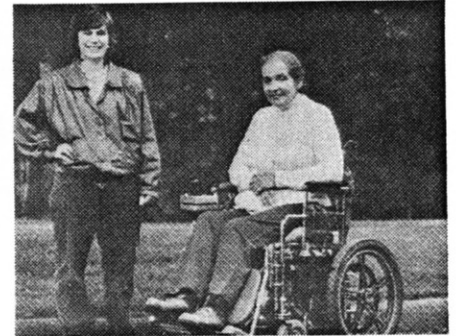
Three important facts may help you decide whether United Way-Princeton Area Communities is an appropriate conduit to the community services you value and want to support.

United Ways are among the most cost-efficient, nonprofit organizations in the nation. Of 1992/93 campaign pledges (your contribution last year), a total of 81 percent of funds donated to the local United Way has been directly allocated to health and human care services, whereas only 14 percent is designated for fundraising and administration. (The other five percent is in uncollectible pledges.)

Local volunteers from among various companies and educational organizations decide how money will be allocated—people like you, who are deeply concerned about wise, effective use of contribution dollars.

United Way-Princeton Area Communities is an autonomous organization with its own volunteer board of trustees. To express their disapproval of mismanaged funds in the United Way of America (the national organization), the local United Way withheld dues until the situation was corrected.

These three facts should put your mind at rest about whether United

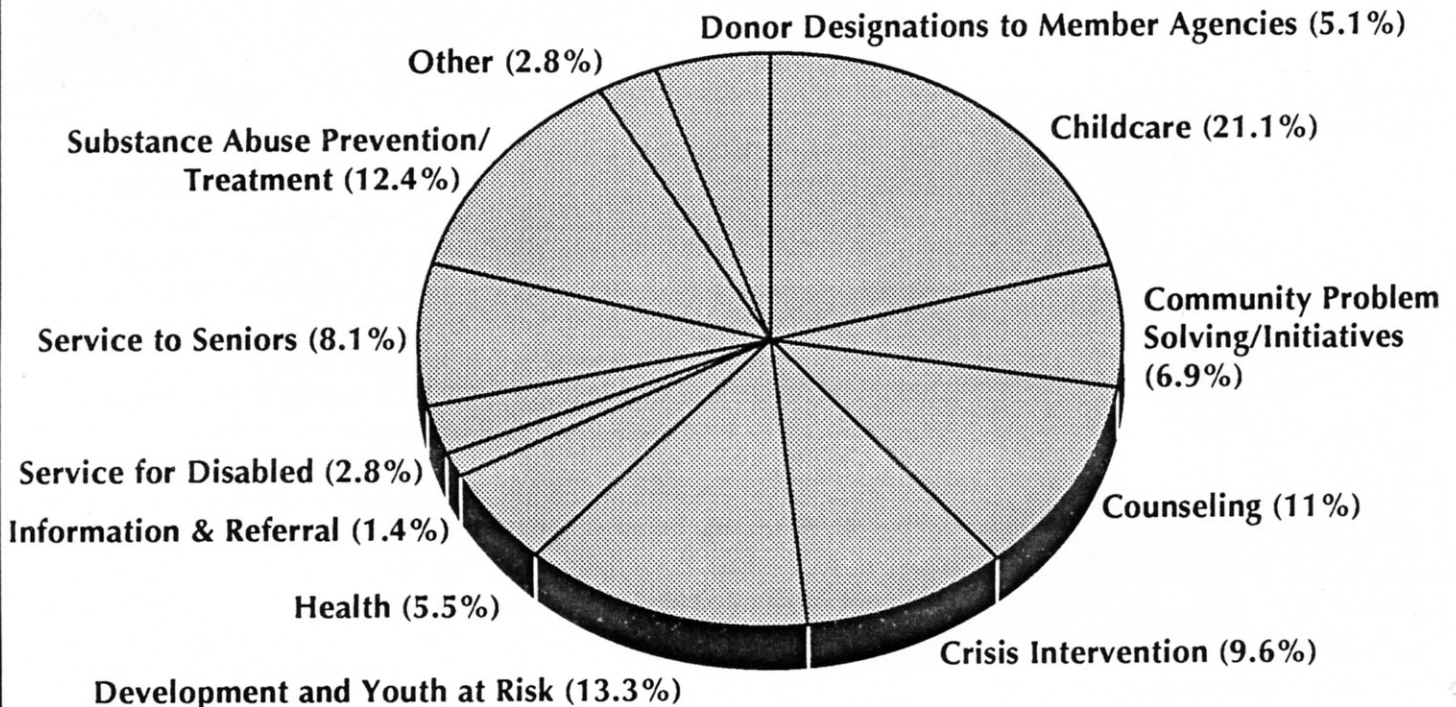


Way-Princeton Area Communities responsibly distributes your contribution dollars.
