Human Errors – Can We Avoid Them?

What do the following have in common – designing hardware to obtain surface samples on Mars, assuring unaccompanied minors arrive at the correct destination, using medical tubes in hospitals for delivering nutrients and medicine, operating a chemical plant? Although different industries with work ranging from high tech to the more routine, all have been impacted by errors made by people. Sometimes these errors result only in stress and inconvenience, but sometimes the consequences are much more significant. This presentation provides an overview of a classification methodology for human errors and how to prevent them.
