


2021 Internship Program for Princeton Undergraduates











The Program in Plasma Science and Technology is pleased to announce an internship program for Princeton University undergraduates. Program funds are available to support a limited number of students working on plasma science and technology research under the guidance of members of the Executive Committee and PPPL research staff and faculty. An internship may be held during the summer months or the school year. possibly at a place remote from Princeton.

Research facilities and opportunities are at the Princeton Plasma Physics Laboratory and on the main campus.
